What is Promise of Hope?

A long-term (six to 12 months), faith-based residence for chemically dependent women

Mission Statement

To enable women to understand and accept Christ's forgiveness and acceptance through the study of God's Holy Word and 12-step recovery programs.

When was it founded?

Promise of Hope was founded May 3, 1999.

Who founded it?

After 22 years of being addicted to drugs and alcohol and the personal experience of several treatment centers, Denise C. Dobbins acted on God's call to minister and work with women suffering from the disease of addiction. Denise along with friends and prayer partners began Promise of Hope in a farm house in Dudley, Georgia.

Who do we serve?

Promise of Hope serves women 18 years and older. We have served over 300 women.

Success Rate

We measure our success by our continued service and growth. In 10 years, we have expanded from six to 20 beds in Dudley, and in April 2009 we opened our first satellite in Baxley with six beds.

Cost

Admission for a new resident is \$2,300 for the first 90-days, which equates to approximately \$767 per month. In 2008 the average actual cost per resident was \$1,386 per month. The fee per resident is just over half of the actual cost per resident.

After 90-days a resident begins work with a local business. The resident fee is \$150 per week, beginning the 91st day. The fee to the resident then becomes less than half the actual cost.

Funding

Promise of Hope is funded through resident fees, donations, fundraising events, and occasional grants.

Addiction: a disease

Addiction is a disease. There is no known cure for addiction; however, the disease can be arrested through complete abstinence from alcohol and other addictive drugs. Once sober and working a 12-step program most addicts recover from the damage caused by their addiction. More than 1.5 million Americans are currently in recovery.

Addiction is also a family disease, directly affecting others close to the addict. These other individuals need and deserve appropriate help to recover as well. Promise of Hope also holds a Family Day once a month for the residents and their family.
